



Changes to the opportunity class placement process for 2020 Year 4 students

The 2021 Year 5 opportunity class placement process was put on hold in April 2020 due to the COVID-19 situation.

We now have a revised and simplified timeline for the OC placement process to ensure that students and families can have certainty about their placement as soon as possible.

The changes include:

- 1. A new date for online applications. Parents must apply between **9 June 2020 and 26 June 2020**. Late applications cannot be accepted.
- A new test date Wednesday 16 September 2020.
 To ensure fair and consistent assessment of students across New South Wales, students will be offered places based only on their test results this year there will be no school assessment scores.
 There will also be no opportunity for appeals given the tight timeframes.

"Yeah, it's good to have someone relying on you all the time; you're a bit more responsible and you're a bit ... yeah, a bit more grown up I suppose."









GROWING FOOD: HEALTHY EATING LEARNING EXPERIENCES

The cooler weather of Autumn and the recent rainfall across many parts of our region might provide the right conditions for revitalising your service's pots and garden beds. Gardening (and the results!) make a great basis for healthy eating learning experiences.



Plants to sow in Autumn

Broccoli Cabbage Chives Beetroot Carrots
Onions
Silverbeet
Radish



Water Saving Tips

- 1.Use mulch to reduce evaporation
- Use a pot and only plant 1 plant per pot.
- 3. Sprout seeds indoors (see below)

SPROUTING SEEDS - A HEALTHY EATING LEARNING EXPERIENCE

What to do:

- 1. Half fill a clear jar with paper towel
- 2. Gently moisten the paper towel with water
- 3. Push seeds into the paper towel around the sides of the jar (pea or bean seeds work well)
- 4. Put in a warm place and watch the seeds grow!
